




- The longest-running grease management provider on the West Coast.







Why maintain grease traps?

Sewer Blockage



Solidified pipe grease can create blockages that wreak all kinds of havoc, from kitchen back-ups to burst pipes and environmental pollution

Fines



Violating your local grease disposal regulations can lead to fines, which create a heavy financial burden in addition to damaging your reputation.

Noxious Fumes



Rancid FOG can give off unpleasant fumes that might be harmful to anyone near the source – including your employees, and your customers.



Grease Trap Maintenance

Grease interceptors should be cleaned on a **regular basis** with appropriate intervals for the volume of grease travelling through the grease trap.

Grease Trap Red Flags

- The impact of poorly maintained grease traps affects businesses, pump vendors, and cities...
- An incorrectly installed grease trap, as well
 as being poorly maintained, left this
 business with \$20,000 in repairs.
- It is vital for business owners to be educated about the health and maintenance of their grease traps.





Grease Trap Red Flags



A neglected grease trap resulted in extreme mold overgrowth and foul odors.

Customer pushes trash down the drain... resulting in extra fees for service.





What happens to the FOG?

- a) Take it to the local digester
- b) Bring it to our plant to heat & reduce the water, then to the digester
- c) Run it through a series of filters and a centrifuge to obtain the oil for renewable fuel and bring the remainder to the digester
- d) All of the above


